Seasonal reminders: Fall and harvest



Share these timely resistance management tips and reminders with your grower audience:

Monitor fields after harvest

- Inspect fields carefully for late-season weeds, insects, and diseases especially
 those showing signs of resistance to current control methods. Remember regular
 scouting and record keeping helps detect issues early.
- If needed, plan post-harvest herbicide applications. Be sure to mix and rotate

herbicides for more impact. Check out <u>How to Manage Herbicide Resistance in</u> **your Fields** for more weed control tips.

Implement crop rotation

- Rotate crops to interrupt lifecycles and reduce the buildup of pests and weed populations.
- Choose crops that disrupt pest and weed cycles.
- Consider winter cover crops to help suppress pest and weed pressure and maintain soil health.

End-of-season resistance evaluation

- Fall is a great time to review the effectiveness of resistance management practices.
 Determine which herbicide, fungicide, or insecticide treatments worked, and identify any that didn't. Make note of any pests or weeds that survive treatments (escapes) to identify any resistance issues.
- Review annual field records: compare which products were used where and when and what pests or weeds showed up with field notes. Evaluating this data will help track any emerging or ongoing resistance trends over time.

Clean equipment

- Remember, weed seeds, insects and disease spores can easily hitchhike on field equipment.
- Thoroughly clean all equipment to prevent the spread of pests and diseases from farm to farm and field to field.
- Thoroughly clean equipment by removing soil, plant debris, and seeds from tires, tracks, undercarriage, and attachment points.
- Be sure to clean grain bins, combines, and storage facilities to avoid carrying over problematic seeds or pathogens before refilling.
